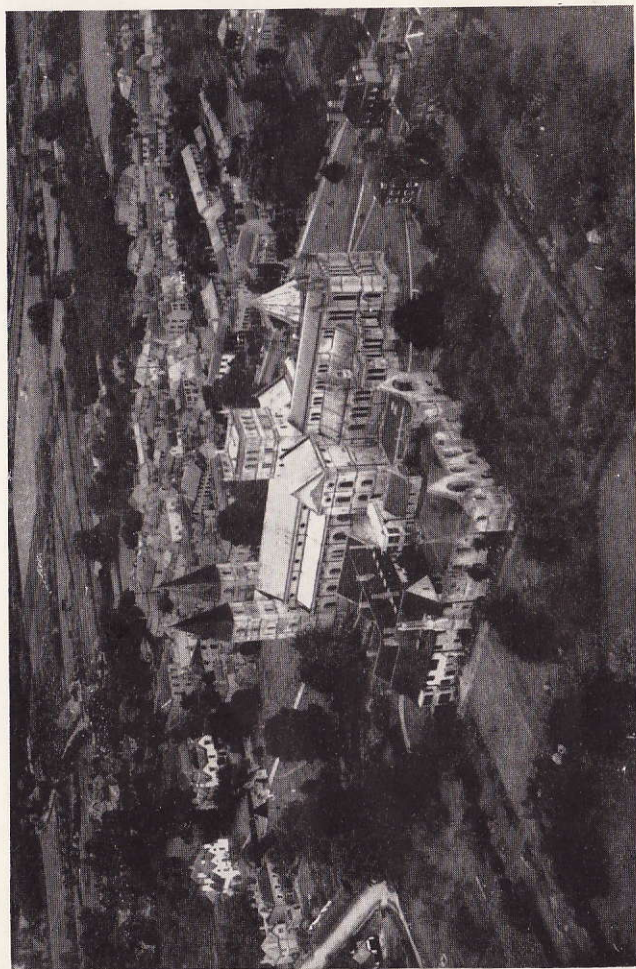

SOUTHWELL MINSTER GRAMMAR SCHOOL

is nearly a thousand years old. Historical records point to it being already in existence in 956.

To-day the School is faced, under the provisions of the Education Act, 1944, with the alternatives of being either

AIDED, in which case

the School's foundation Governors will be in the majority on the Board;

the control of the type of instruction and religious teaching will remain with the school;

the Governors will retain the right of appointment of staff;

the School will be able to continue in many other respects as before; and

the rebuilding of the School will be under the control of the Governors; or

CONTROLLED, in which case control passes almost completely to the Local Education Authority.

There is no doubt that all who know Southwell and its Minster, all who live in the County of Nottinghamshire and friends of the School in many parts of the world will wish to see it become

AIDED

and so enabled to continue to exert its inspiring influence on generations to come as it has done, in a unique way, on their forefathers down the years.

There is a firm belief that a wider public interested in preserving our national heritage will also wish the School to become

AIDED

To preserve the union of Song School and Grammar School which has existed for nearly a thousand years.

To continue the arrangement approved by the Ministry of Education, whereby a Junior Department for Choristers has been established.

And so to retain the close link between the School and the Minster.

For the School to become **AIDED** the Governors must be able to meet half the cost of rebuilding necessary to bring the School

premises to the standard set by the Ministry of Education. It is estimated that the total needed for rebuilding the School and the Boarding House will be ~~£50,000~~, of which the Governors will be required to provide ~~£30,000~~

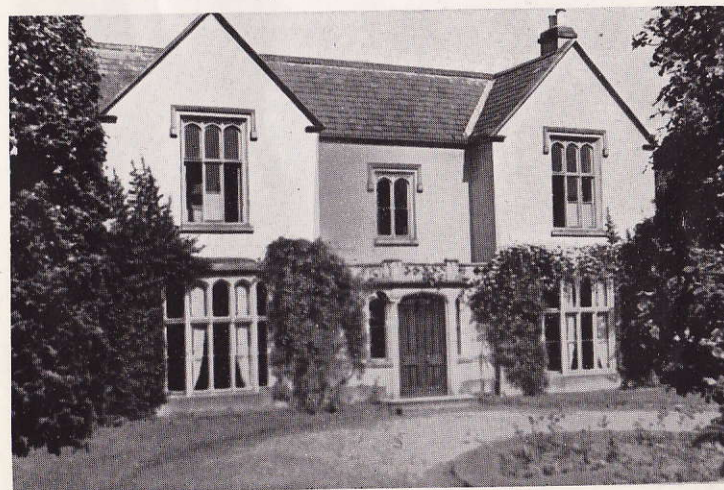

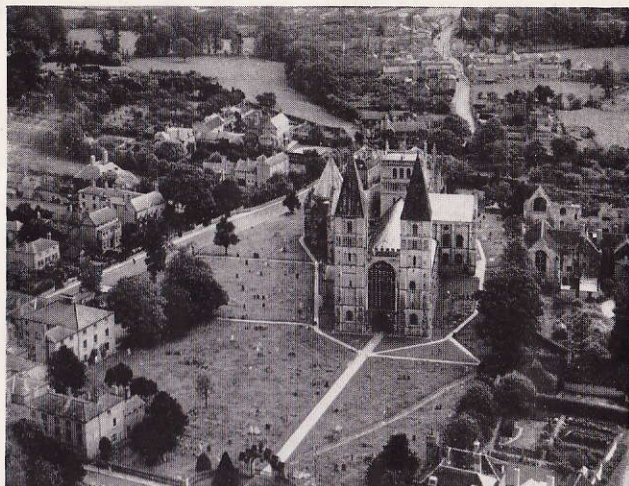

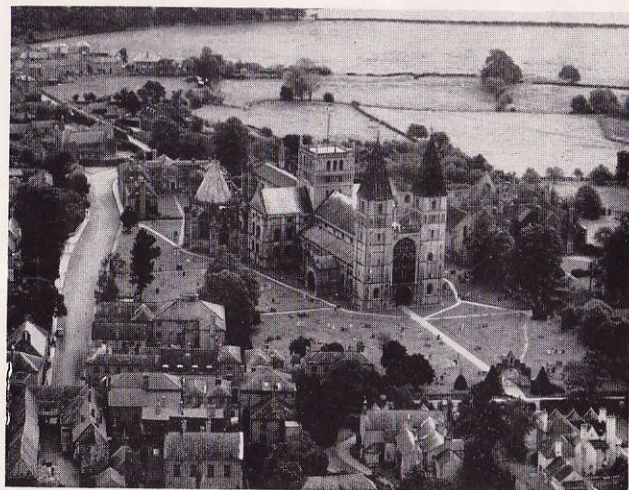
